<mark>Class Issue</mark>

If it is a **class related issue** (e.g., question on syllabus, question pertaining to grades; or team/group dynamics; or TA/ULA issues), the first step is to contact the instructor of the course. If there is no response from the instructor (give them 2-3 business days), or if the issue relates to the course instructor, then contact the Associate Chair, or the Chair, of the Department where the course is offered. This person can be located via the MSU web sites or calling the department office. For example, if the course is a mechanical engineering course, then you would contact the Mechanical Engineering Associate Chair for Undergraduate Studies.

Relationship and Sexual Violence, including Harassment, Stalking, Discrimination and Retaliation
